WATERCOLOUR TECHNIQUES USING DRAWING INKS

MATERIALS

Watercolour paper, inks, spray bottle, table and rock salt, cling wrap, craypas or wax crayons, brush, splatter screen, sponge, paper towel

HOW TO

1.Cling Wrap

- Flood the paper with water
- drop in the inks
- while wet lay a piece of cling wrap over the work and push it into the middle to create folds in the cling wrap
- leave to dry and then take cling wrap off to reveal patterns
- more layers can be added by repeating the process using different colours

2.Salt

- flood your paper
- drop on coloured inks
- sprinkle salt onto wet paper
- · allow the salt to soak up the ink
- · when dry brush off the salt

3. Wax crayons or oil pastels

- draw these onto the paper making marks
- spray the page with water
- drop inks on or brush them on
- spray again and watch the crayon resist the colour to create interesting results

4.Splattering

• Dip a brush into the ink and drag it across the splatter screen onto the paper to create lively surface areas.

5.Lifting out

 While your work is still wet from ink and water use a sponge or paper towel to lightly press on areas to lift out the colour. A great technique to lift out white areas for clouds.
